- Run VSO Programs on MAC

With <u>Parallels Desktop for Mac</u>, you can seamlessly run both Windows and Mac OS X applications side-by-side without rebooting. Powerful performance lets you run Windows productivity applications, even graphic intensive ones with ease, which means you can use all our video conversion programs on your MAC (<u>ConvertXtoDVD</u>, <u>VSO</u> <u>Video Converter</u>, <u>Blu-ray Converter Ultimate</u> and <u>DVD Converter</u>)! Remember that if you have a PC and a MAC you don't need to buy a new license to register your VSO program running with Parallels.
